Upon Motion, the Chairman was requested to write all County Officers, whose pay is fixed by law, to voluntarily take a reduction equal to that received by all County Employees.

Upon Motion, the regular Charity Subjects, heretofore receiving \$4.00 be reduced to \$3.00 per Month.

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Upon Motion, the Chairman and Clerk of this Board were directed and authorized to do whatever necessary to secure from National Reconstruction Finance Corporation, funds for the purposes of building Airports, Roads and other public improvements that might be looked upon favorable by them and in the event money could be secured, that they be authorized further, to make application to State Highway Board for the rebuilding of F.A. Projects 64 and 80.

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The Following Resolution was Offered and Adopted:-

WHEREAS, it appears to this Board that the present Congress will, in all probability pass and enact some legislation for the relief of the unemployed and that such enactment will be administered by the Reconstruction Finance Corporation and that it will be made to apply to States and Political Subdivisions thereof; and,

WHEREAS, it appears to this Board that the unemployment situation in this County is not improving, possibly increasing and that some definite steps should be taken by this Board to try and relieve the condition and after due consideration of all it appears to us that such relief can only be obtained with the help of the Reconstruction Finance Corp., and the State Highway Board, therefore,

It is resolved, that the Chairman and Clerk, be and they are hereby empowered:-

FIRST: To make application to the State Highway Board for a Contract for the clearing, grubbing, grading and construction of bridges, on F.A.P. Nos. 64 and 80 and State Aid P. No. 355-S, a distance of approximately 17 miles, as re-located; and that the prices set up in the Contract shall be the maximum that will be allowed by the State Highway Board, but the prices actually paid being based on actual cost of the work, including supervision and equipment charges, provided these costs do not exceed the unit process set up in the contract.

SECOND: That the Chairman and Clerk are authorized and empowered to make and execute such contract, agreement or other writing as may be desired by said, the State Highway Board.

THIRD: That the Chairman and Clerk are authorized to make application to said Reconstruction Finance Corporation for a loan or loans sufficient to perform the work as set out above and execute any contract, agreement or other writing as may be required.

It is the desire of this Board to use not only free labor but as well, convict labor on the above work and accepting in payment from the State Highway Board Certificates based upon monthly estimates, payable at such future date as may be fixed by said, the State Highway Board.
