

REGULAR MONTHLY MEETING COMMISSIONERS ROADS & REVENUE, GLYNN COUNTY, GEORGIA, HELD
NOVEMBER 7TH., 1933.

Present:- Malcolm B. McKinnon, A. L. Church, W.G.Little, J.B.D.Paulk, R.L.Ratcliffe, and
C. W. Taylor.

Mrs. G. V. Cate, Prof. Eadie and J.A.Cason, representing the Board of Education appear-
ed before the Board and after stating briefly the over-crowded condition of Glynn County
Schools and the condition of some of their Buildings asked that a Bond Election for
\$75,000.00 be called for the purpose of raising money needed for the work as mentioned;

After a discussion of the advisability of calling such election at this time, and the
surplus of State Highway Certificates of Indebtedness, that the County owned, it was agreed
that the time was not opportune for a Bond Election, and that Glynn County's Surplus of
State Highway Certificates would not exceed \$40,000.00 possibly no more than \$35,000.00;
that the Chairman would be authorized to make Application to the Federal Emergency Adminis-
tration of Public Works Board for a Loan from them, including the grant for the sum of

\$50,000.00.

Messrs. T. W. Simpson, and A. M. Way, representing the Glynn County Relief Association ^{Walter} appeared before the Board asking that the County devise some way in which the paupers of the Community could be properly cared for, suggesting that an Appropriation of about \$200.00 be made for that purpose.

Upon Motion the sum of \$25.00 was appropriated to the Red Cross.

Upon Motion the Chairman and Clerk were authorized to execute Contract with State Highway Board for the grading of road from end of Norwich Street paving to Arco, being generally known as Norwich Street Extension of F.A.P.No.64.

THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WAS OFFERED AND ADOPTED:

WHEREAS, It appearing to this Board that there is now existing in the Public Schools of Glynn County a very over-crowded condition, being approximately 400 more pupils than present accommodations can properly care for, and

It appearing that neither the Board of Education, City of Brunswick, or County of Glynn have funds available to relieve the condition, and are not able to secure same, and that without assistance from Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works that the Board of Education will be seriously handicapped in providing proper schooling for all the Children applying.

Therefore, be it, and it is hereby resolved, that the Chairman of this Board be authorized to make application to the Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works for a Loan sufficient in amount to relieve the conditions as set out above, and on such terms and conditions as he may see fit or may be required, offering to deposit such security as may be required.
