Messrs. E.F. Higginbotham, Alex Livingston, N.D. Amos, J.T. Young, Mr. Knight and Others, appeared discussing the fencing of the Coastal Highway from Ogechee River to St. Mary's River. After being discussed the following Resolution was Offered and Adopted:-

A RESOLUTION

Whereas there has been recently such agitation in regards to the roaming of Cattle and Hogs on the Highways, as well as sincere efforts to solve the problem, and,

Whereas such cattle and hogs on the Highways endanger the life, limb and property of motorists, and, whereas on the other hand, such causes great property loss to the cattle owners in that the cattle get killed in amounts of thousands of dollars in value annually, as well as when an animal gets killed or maimed it sets up a most favorable condition for the breeding to the Screw Worm which pest has caused the cattle owners tens of thousands of dollars loss in this section during the past ten months: and,

Whereas, this problem is one that is mutual in which the automobile associations, hotels, gasoline operators, cattle owners, and citizens generally are vitally interested; and,

Whereas it may be possible that the Highway Department will furnish the necessary materials, the Georgia Emergency Relief Administration may furnish the necessary labor to erect suitable fences to prevent cattle and hogs from roaming the highway; and the various counties interested may make certain contributions to aid in the solving of this vital problem to the least damage and hardship of any class,

Therefore, Be it, Resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Glynn County, that we earnestly and respectfully request the Highway Department of Georgia, and the F.E.R.A. to investigate the matter with a view to furnishing the necessary materials and labor to adequately fence the Coastal Highway from the Chatham County Line to the Florida line thus solving the problem to the least damage and hardship to the Cattle Industry of Georgia.

Resolved further, that this Board appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the purpose of helping the solution of the problem by aiding in the purchase of necessary materials.

Resolved further, that copies hereof be sent interested departments, associations, Counties and persons.

Dr. C.H. Ellis, Jr., and Dr. Hirleman, appeared, relative to Tuberculosis Eradication. A Motion was made and accepted and the Chairman was directed to execute the following Contract to begin at once.

Agreement between Dr. Wm. E. White, Chief, Veterinary Advisory Board, on behalf of the State of Georgia, Dr. A. L. Hirleman, Inspector in Charge of Cooperative Tuberculosis Eradication, representing the United States Bureau of Animal Industry, Washington, D.C. and

the Board of County Commissioners of Glynn County, for the purpose of tuberculin testing all cattle in Glynn County, Georgia, with a view of securing State and Federal recognition as a "Modified Accredited Tuberculosis Free Area" for Glynn County.

The State and Federal Government cooperating agree to furnish free of charge to Glynn County the services of veterinarians to tuberculin test all cattle in said County.

The Federal Government agrees to reimburse owners of animals that are slaughtered on account of having reacted to the tuberculin test; such reimbursements to be in accordance with the State and Federal Laws and Regulations.
