Final Recovery & Re-entry Plan – 1:00 p.m.

GLYNN COUNTY, Ga.- Glynn County Department of Public Works, Georgia Power, private contractors and other critical infrastructure operators continue working to restore services to Glynn County. Glynn County Emergency Management Agency continues to coordinate the recovery. Glynn County and City of Brunswick residents should be reminded that critical infrastructure providers continue to work diligently to fully restore services as soon as possible.

St. Simons Island remains at Phase 3 of the re-entry plan. Plan 3 includes those who have **proof of residency or property ownership** on St. Simons and in addition to **employees of businesses located on St. Simons Island**. In addition, media will be allowed to access the St. Simons Island with press credentials.

At 8:00 a.m. on Wednesday, October 12, 2016, Glynn County will implement Phase 4 of the re-entry plan for St. Simons Island. Phase 4 is full public access.

While crews continue to work to remove debris and downed power lines and repair other infrastructure, it is important keep the safety of the utility workers and public safety officials in mind. Please give them space to work safely and remember the Georgia "Move Over" law.

The boil water advisory has been lifted for St. Simons Island. However, you should dump any ice that was made from October 7, 2016 until this morning at 9:30 when the all-clear was granted. In addition, keep in mind that power has been out for extended hours and food may have spoiled in your refrigerator.

The curfew is no longer in place for Glynn County.

Glynn County schools will be will reopen on Monday, October 17, 2016.

- Thursday's regularly scheduled pick up from last week, will occur tomorrow Tuesday, October 11.
- Friday's pick up from last week will occur on Wednesday, October 12
- Monday's pick up from this week will occur on Thursday, October 13
- Tuesday's pick up from this week will be Friday, October 14
- Wednesday's pick up Saturday, October 15
- Thursday's pick up Monday, October 17
- Friday's pick up Tuesday, October 18

This pattern will continue until trash service is caught up.

In addition, a special weather statement has been issued by the National Weather Service to advise the public of possibly dangerous beach debris being moved by wave action caused by a strong local northeaster that will impact our beaches. Please stay away from debris in and near the surf zone for your safety.
