4th of July road closures

GLYNN COUNTY, Ga.- Glynn County would like to advise the public that the following roads and parking areas will be closed for the times outlined below during the 4th of July activities:

- 1) **Mallery St. at Beachview Dr.** – Beginning at 3:00 a.m. on July 4, Mallery St. will be closed to vehicular traffic south of Beachview Dr. until midnight on July 5. Vehicles that are not removed from the area will be towed by 8:00 a.m. At 8:30 p.m., the fireworks safety area located south of Butler Ave. and extending to the beach and walkway in front of the Casino building will be closed to the public until the fireworks show concludes.
- 2) **St. Simons Pier** – St. Simons Pier will be closed off and evacuated beginning at 5:00 a.m. on July 4 and remain closed until after the fireworks vendor clears away elements of the show. The fireworks display is set to begin at 9:00 p.m., weather and darkness permitting. The waters within 1000 feet of the pier in all directions will also be closed to the public.
- 3) **Golden Isles Track Club Fun Run/5k/Wheelchair race** – The Sunshine Festival one mile fun run, 5K Wheelchair, and 5K races will begin at 7:30 a.m., 7:55 a.m., and 8:00 a.m., respectively, on Park Ave. across from Mallery Park ball fields. Mallery St. will be closed intermittently as runners and wheelchairs cross into the Kings Terrace Subdivision and return. The route will begin on Park Ave. across from Mallery Park and travel down Magnolia Ave., Bartow St, Anshantilly Ave., Anquila Ave., Delegal St., Magnolia Ave., and Oak St.
- 4) **Golf cart parade** – The annual golf cart parade will be held from 2:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. and begin at Mallery Park. The parade route will take Mallery St. to the pier then up to Beachview Dr., Demere Rd., Ocean Blvd., and back to Mallery Park via Mallery St. During the parade, Mallery St., Beachview Dr., and Ocean Blvd. will be closed to vehicular traffic.
