## **Zero tolerance for "Frat Beach"**

GLYNN COUNTY, Ga. – The Glynn County Board of Commissioners has distributed a letter to the University of Georgia, Georgia Southern, the College of Coastal Georgia, and area high schools that outlines the zero tolerance policy the County will have for unlawful behavior during the weekend of the Georgia/Florida game. The unofficial event that takes place on St. Simons Island the Friday before the game (October 30, 2015) known as "Frat Beach" is of particular concern to the community.

By transmission of the attached letter, the County is notifying administrators at each institution of the pro-enforcement measures that will be in place in order to deter underage drinking, disorderly conduct, littering, and other illegal activities that have become problematic in years past. The universities, college, and high schools will take a proactive stance in getting the message out to students by working with the Student Government Associations, Interfraternity Councils, and Panhellenic Councils.

The ultimate goal of the Board of Commissioners is to protect the health and welfare of both residents and visitors and to continue the tradition of hosting football fans in a way that reflects our values as a community for generations to come.
