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## **Hurricane Dorian Update #10**

GLYNN COUNTY, Ga.- The track of this storm is very similar to previous storms that have passed our coast, but Hurricane Dorian is expected to still be at hurricane strength in our area. If you experienced wind damage and flooding during those storms, you may experience the same during this event. All of Glynn County and the entire City of Brunswick is currently under a Storm Surge Warning and a Hurricane Warning. Increasing wind speeds are predicted through tonight and the strongest sustained winds are expected on barrier islands. Strong wind gusts are expected as far as Interstate 95.

Businesses should continue to use their best judgement and follow their hurricane plans in decisions to close. If you feel unsafe in any area and are able to leave, use your best judgement and follow your hurricane plan.

Starting tonight, September 3, 2019 from 10:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m a curfew is in effect for the evacuated Zone A of Glynn County and the entire City of Brunswick. The Jekyll Island Authority has also a curfew in effect and the Jekyll Island Causeway is closing at 8:00 p.m. September 3, 2019. The Georgia Department of Transportation will close the Sidney Lanier Bridge in preparation of the predicted high winds at 8:00 p.m.

The F. J. Torras Causeway WILL NOT close unless deemed dangerous or impassable to allow for people to evacuate and for public safety to respond for as long as possible.

The threat of sustained tropical storm force winds and storm surge will affect power to critical JWSC assets on Saint Simons. JWSC staff is closely monitoring the potential arrival of local impacts. Any necessary outage notification is to be distributed immediately using our emergency notification system. Glynn County is not accepting evacuees and will not open a shelter during the storm. If evacuees need a shelter location, contact the Red Cross at 1-800-733-2767.

Republic Services trash pickup continues to be suspended and will resume when conditions allow.

There are several closures at this time.

- Glynn County, Brunswick, JWSC, and the Glynn County School system offices, including all courts are closed until Friday September 6, 2019. All meetings for these entities are cancelled that this time through Thursday.
- Jekyll Island Authority offices and amenities are closed until further notice.
- The College of Coastal Georgia has cancelled classes, closed the dorms, and will suspend all non-essential operations for Tuesday, September 3, 2019. Visit [www.ccgga.edu](http://www.ccgga.edu) for updates.
- The Federal Law Enforcement Training Center (FLETC) has evacuated the campus.
- The Coastal Pines Golden Isles Campus will be closed Wednesday and Thursday.
- Sea Island will close at 12:00 p.m. until further notice.
- The Southeast Georgia Health System will remain open throughout the storm and the hospitals will continue to care for inpatients, including maternity patients. The [Emergency Care Centers](#) will also remain open. All outpatient services and elective surgeries scheduled for Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, September 3-5, 2019 are cancelled and patients will be contacted to reschedule procedures. All Southeast Georgia Physician Associates practices, including the [Immediate Care Centers](#), will be closed until Friday, Sept. 6. Patients will be contacted to reschedule appointments.
