State law allows the calling of a meeting without giving twenty-four hours' notice when special circumstances exist.

On Monday, March 23, 2020, Governor Brian Kemp issued an Executive Order to for the state of Georgia to limit large gatherings statewide, order "shelter in place" for specific populations, and close bars and nightclubs for fourteen days due to COVID-19.

Chairman Browning called for this emergency meeting to consider adopting an Emergency Order Resolution related to the Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19) to prohibit gatherings of more than 10 people; to close restaurants to close to the public except to provide take out, delivery, drive-through, or curbside service; and for other purposes.

The legal organ, The Brunswick News, and other local media were notified via email and telephone of this meeting on Tuesday, March 24, 2020. The meeting notice was also posted on the county's website.

Discussion and consideration of voting on the following:

1. Consider adopting an Emergency Order Resolution related to the Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19) to prohibit gatherings of more than 10 people; to close restaurants to close to the public except to provide take out, delivery, drive-through, or curbside service; to close business locations for the sale of alcoholic beverages for consumption on the premises of bars, lounges, nightclubs, and similar establishments; to close all establishments providing body care services which require physical contact between the provider and client except any services performed by or under the direct supervision of a licensed medical doctor, nurse, dentist, physical therapist, chiropractor, or other healthcare professional; to close all indoor or outdoor public and private public pools regulated by the Department of Public Health, and all indoor recreation, fitness and/or entertainment facilities; to close all County parks and recreation facilities for use by the public, except walking trails and open passive park areas, marinas/boat ramps, dog parks, and campground facilities; to toll deadlines for Occupation Tax License Renewals and deadlines for actions, determinations, and decisions under the Code of Ordinances, Zoning Ordinance, and Subdivision Regulations; and for other purposes. Commissioner Browning announced that the emergency special called meeting was due to COVID-19 and that this was the first time the Glynn County Board of Commissioners were meeting via virtual teleconference. He then took a roll call of the members of the Board and staff that were in attendance.

Aaron Mumford, County Attorney, went through the drafted Emergency Order to explain each section.

The Board held a discussion regarding the Emergency Order.

A motion was made by Commissioner Brunson and seconded by Commissioner Coleman to adopt the emergency order resolution with the addition of picnic areas to Section 8. The motion carried unanimously. Resolution #R-15-20
