PRETRIAL SCHEDULING ORDER

The following Order shall govern this criminal case. Absent express permission from the Court, no exceptions, extensions, or waivers to the requirements set forth herein are allowed. The term "Defendant" refers to each of the named defendants individually.

The above-styled case having come before this Court for arraignment on July 17, 2020, and **IT IS HEREBY ORDERED** as follows:

A. DISCOVERY:

1. Defendant has until July 31, 2020 to opt into reciprocal discovery as set forth at O.C.G.A. § 17-16-1 *et. seq.*
2. If Defendant elects to participate in reciprocal discovery under O.C.G.A. § 17-16-1 *et. seq.*, both parties shall serve all discovery materials upon opposing counsel no later than August 28, 2020. If Defendant procures new counsel, it shall be the duty of the original attorney for Defendant to provide all discovery served upon him/her to the new attorney.

B. MOTION HEARINGS:

1. All demurrers and claims of immunity are to be filed within ten (10) days of arraignment in accordance with O.C.G.A. § 17-7-110.
2. All particularized motions and notices, including but not limited to (a) motions to suppress, (b) Jackson/Denno motions, and (c) notices of evidence of other crimes, wrongs, or acts (including, but not limited to, 404 notices) shall be filed on or before September 30, 2020.
3. Generalized and omnibus motions will not be considered by the Court. All motions shall specify, with particularity, the item, statement, and/or event at issue. Thus, for example, a motion to suppress any and all statements is insufficient; the motion must identify the specific statement, or portion of the statement, the movant is seeking to suppress, as well as the theory of suppression.

4. All responsive pleadings shall be filed on or before **October 28, 2020**.
5. **If an evidentiary hearing is requested the pleading must contain a notice to the Court in the caption under the criminal action number as follows:** “Evidentiary Hearing Requested”; or requests for hearings can be made in writing contemporaneously with the filing of the relevant motion or response. If a written request for hearing is submitted, the request must be filed as a separate pleading bearing the caption of the case and entitled “Request for Evidentiary Hearing”. **WHEN A HEARING IS REQUESTED, NOTIFY THE COURT AT** SGlaudel@chathamcounty.org. Failure to specifically request a hearing as set forth herein shall be deemed by the Court as a waiver of an evidentiary hearing on the issue raised making the matter ripe before the Court. If a hearing is properly requested one will be scheduled by the Court.

C. TRIAL DOCKET CALL:

The State and Defendant shall appear before the Court for a docket call on **TBD** and be prepared to inform the Court as to any remaining issues to be resolved. A trial date will be assigned for all cases announced as “Ready.” All motions in limine shall be filed at least five (5) days prior to this date. Extensions may be granted for good cause shown.


D. OTHER:

All parties are being served with a copy of this Pretrial Scheduling Order on today’s date. No further notice shall be given and all parties are expected to comply with this Order and be present on the dates and times set by the Court. Failure to comply with a deadline may result in sanctions.
