The following questions were received and then passed on to the respective project manager for responses. The questions are in the questioner's own words. - 1. Will the county require Geotech to be performed during the design process due to the roadway widening? I didn't see it listed in the proposal so I just wanted to confirm the scope and to see if it should be included in our fee.**
No geotechnical investigation/report is required for this project.
- 2. Is a traffic study required or has one been completed that can be provided?**
No traffic study is required for this project. No recent traffic analysis has been performed. See the GDOT concept report for past analysis.
- 3. Will right-of-way acquisition coordination, plats, etc be handled by the county or the engineering consultant as a part of this project?**
The county will be responsible for all right-of-way acquisition activities. The selected design firm will just be responsible for the complete right-of-way plan set.
- 4. Can electronic signatures be used on proposal forms?**
Yes
- 5. Can the County confirm that subcontractors do not need to complete any required forms for proposal submission?**
Correct. Upon award, there will need to be forms completed and signed by subcontractors.

6. Is there a proposal page limit?

There is no proposal page limit.

7. Should the fee proposal go on the USB as well?

Yes.

8. Is the project 100% local funded or will State or Federal funding be included?

The project is 100% locally funded through SPLOST 2022 funds.
