

**OFFICIAL GENERAL MUNICIPAL AND SPECIAL ELECTION BALLOT
OF THE STATE OF GEORGIA
NOVEMBER 3, 2009**

To vote, blacken the Oval (●) next to the candidate of your choice. To vote for a person not on the ballot, manually WRITE IN his or her name in the space provided, then blacken the corresponding Oval (●). If you desire to vote YES or NO for a PROPOSED QUESTION, blacken the corresponding Oval (●). Use only pen or pencil. If you spoil your ballot, do not erase, but ask for a new ballot.

<p align="center">For Mayor (Vote for One)</p> <p><input type="radio"/> BRYAN THOMPSON (Incumbent)</p> <p><input type="radio"/></p> <p>Write-in _____</p>	<p align="center">1 % Sales Tax for Educational Purposes (Vote for One)</p> <p>Shall a one percent sales and use tax for educational purposes be imposed in the Glynn County School District for a period of time not to exceed 20 consecutive calendar quarters in order to raise not more than \$160,450,000 for the purpose of acquiring, constructing, and equipping the following capital outlay projects: (i) a new Southwest Middle School; (ii) a new Brunswick High School, including necessary demolition, renovation and upgrades to existing facilities and associated site and field work; (iii) renovations and additions to Risley Early College Academy (formerly Risley Middle School); (iv) renovations and additions to Glynn Academy; (v) a new fine arts center to be known as the Coastal Community Center for the Arts; (vi) renovations to the Historic Risley Center; (vii) renovations to Altama and Burroughs-Molette Elementary Schools; (viii) a new elementary school; (ix) demolition at the former Jane Macon Middle School and Glynn Middle School; and (x) other real and personal property for the school system, including any necessary demolition, site improvements, renovations, and improvements to facilities, land acquisition, technology upgrades, computers and related technology including fiber and software, telephone and communication equipment, computerized energy management systems, heating and air conditioning systems, lighting, and similar property and equipment in accordance with its facilities plans, as the same may be revised in accordance with the needs of the School District?</p> <p>If imposition of the tax is approved by the voters, such vote shall also constitute approval of the issuance of general obligation debt of the Glynn County School District in a principal amount not to exceed \$75,000,000 for the above capital outlay purposes and for the payment of capitalized interest on such debt.</p> <p><input type="radio"/> YES</p> <p><input type="radio"/> NO</p>
